



74 Ethiopian Govt full scholarship postgraduate students from Ethiopia graduate from Sharda University

On 10th of August 2019 Sharda University participated in the graduation ceremony of 74 Sharda University postgraduate Master students from Ethiopia who completed their studies in Sharda University. The function took place in Vishwa Yuvak Kendra in New Delhi and was organized by the Ethiopian Student Association of India. The students came to study in Sharda University two years ago with scholarships from Government of Ethiopia together with 25 more postgraduate students who are currently studying in the PhD programme. The International Relations Department of Sharda University was a mentor and guide to the students throughout their studies and their stay at Sharda University and assisted the students with every aspect of their studies and life in India as per the vision of Honorable Chancellor Mr. P.K. Sharda University Uzbekistan has been established in line with Sharda's commitment to offer world class education to everyone. It is the first offshore campus of Sharda University, India's truly global university with students from 80+countries which has over the years become one of the leading centres of education, research and innovation in Delhi NCR region.

Initially the new branch campus will host IT and Business Administration related subjects such as Bachelor degrees in Electrical Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Computer Science, Information Technology and Cyber Security, Business Administration, Commerce and Master degrees in Business Administration & Commerce. Students can start

their studies in either of the 2 campuses & transfer to another campus in Year 2 or Year 3.

The Agreement for the establishment of Sharda University Uzbekistan was signed in January during the visit of the Governor of Andijaan, Uzbekistan. Mr. P. K. Gupta, Hon'ble Chancellor signed the agreement on behalf of Sharda University.

As Uzbekistan is an emerging country in the Eurasian region, Sharda University Uzbekistan aims to be India's first campus in Eurasia, not only serving students from Uzbekistan but students coming from the neighbouring Eurasian countries, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Turkmenistan & Tajikistan. The new university is expected to create a strategic educational presence in the whole Eurasian region.

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Nepalese New year 2076 B.S

With the support and coordination of International Relations Division of Sharda University, Nepalese students celebrated their New Year 2076 B.S. (actual date 13 Apr'19- holiday) on 12th April 2019 at Sharda University, Block 4 lawn from 5pm to 7.30pm. Although these students were far from their homes, they kept unity and bonding with their culture alive in India. Through cultural presentations performed by Nepalese students, they have showcased the culture, traditions and ways of life of Nepal. In a university with diverse cultural backgrounds and with students coming from 55+ countries, the Nepalese students were proud to present their cultural heritage to the university community.

Navavarsha is an official public holiday in Nepal. It is celebrated with esteem and piety. The celebrations include joyful activities such as street dances, parades, feasts, and family reunion. According to the Nepalese tradition, Nepal celebrates its religious merriments on a varying date based on

the lunar calendar. It generally occurs between April 11th and 15th, which is considered by the Nepalese as the first day of Baisakh, the first month of the Bikram Sambat calendar. The entire country rejoices with colorful ornaments and with social activities as they welcome the Nepalese New Year. Just like many other countries, they commemorate the event hoping to have lost of blessings and prosperity as they welcome the New Year.

The major part of the event is centered to Hinduist religious rituals. Nepalese New year 2076 B.S According to these Nepalese New Year rituals, the Nepalese start their day early in the morning with prayers and worship inside temples by offering Puja. This Puja is a ritual devoted to the gods in Hinduism. After Puja is finished, they walk around the temple counter-clockwise while at the same time they are ringing bells.

Moreover, the festivities include traditional games and sports that Nepalese organize during their New Year. Likewise, most young people participate in pageants and contests showcasing their talents.

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Celebration of Nowruz 2019

Nowruz (pronounced no-rooz) is a combination of two Persian words. The first word "now" means new and the second word "ruz" means day, together they mean "New Day." Nowruz is the name for the celebrations that observe the New Year for many Persian and Central Asian communities. The exact beginning of the New Year occurs when the season changes from winter to spring on the vernal equinox, which usually happens on 20th or 21st March each year. The spelling of Nowruz in English can take many forms, including: Noroz, Norouz, Nowruz & Norooz. This year the Nowruz was celebrated by Afghan students in Sharda University on the 29th of March 2019. The event was composed of several activities such as a presentation on Afghanistan, Afghani cultural dress show and fashion show, Atan dance, Qarsak dance, and Afghan girls dance.

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Sharda in Kyrgyzstan Visits of International University of Kyrgyzstan

International Relations Division invited a delegation from International University of Kyrgyzstan (IUK) to visit Sharda University on April 01, 2019. An MoU on the Creation of an International School of Information Technology in IUK and the Creation of Kyrgyz-Indian School of Medical Sciences (KISMS) under the International School of Medicine of the Academic Consortium, IUK will be signed during the visit of the Kyrgyz officials during that day.

This is the second visit of high officials from IUK. An MoU Agreement was signed at the end of February 2019 between Sharda University and The International University of Kyrgyzstan. The two universities agreed to cooperate in education and research in areas of mutual interest. The MoU encouraged direct contact and cooperation between faculty members, research institutions and students as well as cooperation for clinical and academic knowledge exchange between Vedanta and Sharda Teaching Hospital/s, setting up Telemedicine services, and establishing and developing an Information Technology (IT) institute under International University of Kyrgyzstan.

The International University of Kyrgyzstan is a university in Bishkek (capital city), Kyrgyzstan. IUK has been rated as "the most students from entire Kyrgyzstan". The university was established by decree of the President of the Kyrgyz Republic, Askar Akayev, on March 11, 1993. The International University of Kyrgyzstan is a state university with the status of International Higher Education and has a direct relationship to the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic. The International School of Medicine at IUK is an international higher educational institution, it is a structural unit of International university of Kyrgyzstan, created to train medical specialists for foreign countries, conduct medical research in cooperation with leading health centers of the country and provide high quality medical services to the population of Central Asia.



Visit and Educational Partnership with Jinan University, China

A delegation Jinan University, one of China's oldest and most reputed universities, visited Sharda University on Tuesday 19th March, 2019. The delegation which was invited by International Relations Division. The Delegation met with Honorable Vice Chancellor, Dean SBS, Prof. Dr. Mehra, and the Director International Relations, Mr. Ashok Daryani. The meeting focussed on educational partnership with Sharda University for student and Academic Faculty exchange, joint courses and programs, joint research and industry projects and short-term programs. The visit was concluded by signing an MoU that will enable the two universities begin their activities towards building a solid, log-term, and fruitful educational partnership.

Jinan University is a key comprehensive university which is listed in '211 Project' of the People's Republic of China, and jointly constructed by Overseas Chinese Affairs Office of the State Council, Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China and the Guangdong Province. It is a public research and comprehensive university based in Tianhe District, Guangzhou city, Guangdong province, China. It is one of the oldest universities established on China tracing back to the Qing dynasty (1644-1911). Jinan University's mission is to

spread Chinese learning and culture from North to South, and from China overseas. It was the first university in China to recruit foreign students, and it is currently the Chinese university with the largest number of international students. Jinan has a lot of famous subjects home and aboard, such as Science of Medicine, Pharmaceutical Science, Science of Chemistry, Science of Engineering, Science of Economics, Science of Finance, Science of Journalism & Communication. And Chinese Language & Literature, especially Overseas Chinese Language, is the characteristic subject of Jinan University. The partnership with Jinan University is expected to strengthen the international presence of Sharda University as per the vision of Honorable Chancellor Shri P. K. Gupta for Sharda University to become India's Global University.







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Five Sharda Students Receive Scholarship to Study in Karabuk University, Turkey

Abhishek Kumar and Uman Niyaz from 3rd Year BTech CSE, and Shruti Vatsa, Renuka Kumari, and Aabid Hussain from 3rd Year BA (Hons) English, have received Mevlana Exchange Programme scholarships from the Turkish Department of Higher Education to go and study for 1 semester in Karabuk University, Turkey. The scholarships were awarded through an agreement that Sharda University and Karabuk University have signed last year for student and Faculty exchange under the umbrella of Mevlana Exchange Programme, Government of Turkey and they cover 100% of tuition and accommodation expenses in Turkey.

Mevlana Exchange Programme aims the exchange of

students between the Turkish higher education institutions and higher education institutions of other countries. Outgoing students may study in Turkey for 1 academic semester. The same applies with students from Turkey going to partner universities across the world.

Established in 2007, Karabuk University is a non-profit public higher education institution located in the suburban setting of the large town of Karabuk (population range of 50,000-249,999 inhabitants). This institution has also branch campuses in Safranbolu, Eflani, and Yenice. Officially accredited and recognized by the Turkish Council of Higher Education, Karabuk University is a very large (uniRank enrollment range: over-45,000 students) coeducational higher education institution. The university offers courses and programs leading to officially recognized higher education degrees in several areas of study such as Engineering and Technology, Medical Sciences, Business, Languages, Humanities, Basic Sciences, Fine Arts and Design, Allied Health Sciences, Social Sciences, Theology, Administrative Sciences, and Physical Education.







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Three Sharda Students Receive Scholarship to study in Celal Bayar University, Turkey

Nikita Sharma from 3rd Year B.Tech. CSE, and Prashant Bhardwaj and Abinash Adhikari from 3rd Year BTech Biotechnology, have received Mevlana Exchange Programme scholarships from the Turkish Department of Higher Education to go and study for 1 semester in Celal Bayar University, Turkey. The scholarships were awarded through an agreement that Sharda University and Celal Bayar University have signed for student and Faculty exchange under the umbrella of Mevlana Exchange Programme, Government of Turkey and they cover all expenses.

Mevlana Exchange Programme aims the exchange of students between the Turkish higher education institutions and higher education institutions of other countries. Outgoing students may study in Turkey for 1 academic semester. The same applies with students from Turkey going to partner universities across the world.

Celal Bayar University (CBU) is a public university located in Manisa, a beautiful historical city in the Aegean region of Turkey. The university offers over 60-degree programmes at undergraduate and postgraduate level.

More than 2781 people are involved in running Manisa Celal Bayar University (among them administrative staff: 1160, academic staff: 1614, foreigners working on agreement: 7). The aim of the university with its 55 thousand students (among them 652 are foreign students from 48 countries) is to support student exchange programmes and thus to be able to provide the opportunity of having two diplomas. Manisa Celal Bayar University (MCBU) benefits the multicultural heritage of the city of Manisa, the history of which dates back to 1450-1200s BC. MCBU is among the leading universities in the Aegean Region in terms of number of students.



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Yoga Retreat Program for China Students & Valediction Ceremony at Sharda

10 students and 2 members of Academic Faculty from Zhengzhou Normal University, P.R. China came in Sharda University for a 2-week Yoga Retreat Programme from 17th of June, 2019 to 29th of June, 2019. The Chinese students attended regular Yoga workshops taught by expert Yoga Faculty in Sharda University for 1 week, and in week 2 they visited Rishikesh in the Himalayan foothills beside the Ganges River, a city that is well renowned as a center for studying yoga and meditation where they complete their programme by learning and understanding the spiritual India as well as the culture and heritage of India. And as March 2018, Zhengzhou University is on the list of Ministry-Province Co-constructed Universities Project, announced by the Chinese Ministry of Education, during the National People's Congress and the Chinese Political Consultative Conference.



Can Thao University Can Tho University was established in 1966 and it is a multi disciplinary leading university in the Mekong Delta. It has nine colleges and three research institutes, Agriculture, Fisheries, Economics, Engineering, Environment, ICT, Natural Sciences, Rural Development, Education, Languages, Political Science, Humanities, and Law. The current training capacity of CTU is more than 45,000 students involving full-time undergraduate and postgraduate students, part-time as well as distancelearning ones. CTU possesses approximately 100 training programs and branches of undergraduate including 2 advanced training programs in English, 45 Master training programs (in which 1 program is a joint-ventured training field with foreign partners and 3 programs are taught in English) and 16 PhD ones, together with 2 training programs of junior college.

Afghanistan-India historical bilateral relation

Landlocked Afghanistan links Central Asia with South Asia and, to some extent, with West Asia or the Middle East. The latter is also connected through Afghanistan to India. Being a landlocked and mountainous country; Afghans mostly depend on agricultural activities for their livelihoods. The other aspect of the Afghan economy is the country's dependence on trade and commerce. In fact, since ancient time Afghanistan was a transit route between the Indian subcontinent and the Far East. The trade relations between India and Afghanistan continued even during the British colonial period. India, after independence, having not a strong economy, signed many bilateral trade agreements with different countries of the world, including Afghanistan.

Historically, though there has been a lack of information and reliable statistics about Afghanistan's economy but the early modern period under the rule of kings Abdul Rahman Khan (1880-1901) and Habibullah Khan (1901-1919), speaks of great deal of Afghan commerce was centrally controlled by the Afghan government. The Afghan monarchs were eager to develop the stature of government & the country's military capability. Hence attempt was made to raise money by the imposition of state monopolies on the sale of commodities and high taxes. This affected the long-term development

of Afghanistan during that period. Western technologies & manufacturing methods were introduced gradually keeping in view the

growing army. Hence an emphasis was placed on the manufacture of weapons & other military materiel. The Afghan king then took the initiative in inviting foreigner powers to invest in the country.

This was not possible without king permission for outsiders, to set up large-scale enterprises in Afghanistan during that period. In the post-independence period, Indian political leaders focused on the revitalization of the socio economic condition of the country. PM Nehru recognized that economic strength was central to the stability & social coherence of the country. He always wanted India to have a robust economic base. With economic strength is one of the most important pillars of foreign policy.
