





The department offers a 3 year degree course in Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in English. This sets a base for higher academic degree in English Literature by inculcating within the students a crucial skill set of critical reading, phonetics, creative writing, and analytical thinking. The course attempts to establish a connection between Literature from all around the world and its consequent relation to the contemporary society. Candidates proficient in English Language, having a zeal for understanding humanity through the lens of literature, and who have passed Senior Secondary (10+2) with 50% marks from a recognized board are eligible for this course.

The department also offers Masters in English as a 2 year degree course aimed to cater to students looking for higher academic degree in English Literature. Students with B.A. English with a minimum of 50% marks are eligible to pursue it. The course surveys the canon of English literary studies as well as the latest trends in literature written in English Language from all over the world.

Students are trained in rigorous in-depth textual analysis and encouraged to develop critical writing and research skills.

Ph.D. in English is offered to those who qualify the two tier entrance exam held by the University. Candidates need to first clear a written exam based on their subject expertise. After this round, short-listed candidates are called for an interview session with subject matter experts. Selected Ph.D. scholars are expected to complete one year of course work after which work on dissertations ensue.



B.A. Political Science is an undergraduate programme focusing on the study of theory, practice, description along with the analysis of political system and behaviour. With a detailed study of the political, national and international system, the programme trains its students in historical and modern political system, public administration, governmental policies and procedures, international relations and public affairs. The programme not just deals with modern political scenarios but also encompasses the history of various political revolutions across the world thus helping a student learn the political practices of countries around the world. As politics routinely affects our lives and as more of the masses partake in activism, political science professionals are needed. A Bachelor of Political Science degree can provide the knowledge and skills needed to meet this growing demand.

The programme highlights Political Thought (both Indian and Western) and Political Theories, Select Constitutions of the World, and Public Administration and Human Rights, while strictly focussing on Indian Constitution, Indian Political Thought, Indian Administration, and Local Self Government.

Masters in Political Science addresses some of the fundamental problems facing human society: war and peace, authoritarianism and democracy, economic development and inequality, and environment degradation. It helps in examining political ideas, ideologies, institutions, policies, processes, and behaviour, as well as groups, socio-economic

classes, governments, diplomacy, law and strategy. The course offers well-rounded training in social science. Apart from learning about India, Asia and the world, the curriculum focuses on critical thinking and writing, research and analysis, methodology, and ethical reasoning. Sociology is the study of human social relationships and groups. Sociology's subject matter is diverse, ranging from crime to religion, from the family to the state, from the divisions of race and social class to the shared beliefs of a common culture, and from social stability to radical change in whole societies. Sociology students learn to be reflective thinkers, practising problem-solving and critical thinking skills commonly sought by employers.

Sociologists ask how class, gender, race, ethnicity, age and geographic region affect access to scarce resources like wealth, income, power and prestige as they explore the nature and operation of the social institutions.

The MA Sociology course will cover five courses each across three semesters and in the last semester, three courses will be offered alongside a dissertation. The course is directed at addressing social exclusion drawing on the perspectives of class, caste and gender. Through a study of social institutions and the roles of the agencies, concerns around politics, technology, identity and work are addressed. There is also a course on contemporary social worlds that offers a comparative perspective to gain insights about the historical, economic and cultural changes. This course will enable them to choose careers in the fields of education, research, social work, advertising, media, creative writing, film making, visual and sound studies, Government jobs as well as entrepreneurial pursuits.






