#### **Conference Background & Objective**

Rapid advances in medical science and better care of elderly, improvement in nutrition, mass Immunization against diseases and due to decreasing infant mortality rate, late marriages and later child bearing the absolute numbers of the elderly over 60 years is fast increasing. Today, 60% of world's older people live in Asia and by 2025 it will increase to 75%. However, the problems of elderly is overshadowing the joy of longevity and affect the social, economic and physical well being of individuals, their families and their society. In case of chronically ill elderly persons, the care becomes more difficult. In process of life cycle of human being, there are numerous challenges to be faced by people.

The number of elderly living alone is also fast increasing for reasons of scattered families, economic compulsions and their preference to live in their own domain. The elderly living in towns and cities, with or without families, are subjected to altogether different problems including joblessness, isolation and alienation, absence of care, problem of movement, nutritional deficiency, and the like. With the children settled in their own lives, elderly are compelled to adjust themselves in whatever circumstances. Elderly people and especially older women in nuclear or small families remain mostly isolated. Many elderly are now more prone to alienation and marginalization with little or no financial support and unable to use property and money. They have for social reasons, face, acute health problems due to negligence, lack of financial support and traditional mindset, live with uncomfortable and strained relations subjected to maltreatment and abuses. The special bonding between grandparents and grandchildren are fading fast and the tradition of the elderly care by the family is fast disappearing.

To create a wide awareness on problems, challenges and issues in population ageing and old age care, **Sharda School** of Law, Centre for Human Rights and Child Gender Justice, Sharda University in collaboration with National Institute of Social Defense (NISD) Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment Government of India, New Delhi will be organizing a Two Day National Conference at Sharda University from March 21st – 22nd, 2023.

#### **Publication Opportunities**

All papers shall go through double blind peer review before publication and only papers recommended by reviewers shall be published. The accepted best quality papers presented in the conference shall be published in the form of UGC Care/Scopus/Springer/ ISBN book.

#### **Guidelines to Authors**

The research papers should be in the range of anything between 3000-6000 words and abstract should be about 250 words. The submission should be in Microsoft Word format only, written in A4 single column format, 1.5 line spacing, using Times New Roman font, 12 point font size and normal margins. Keep the layout of the text as simple as possible. References cited in the text should conform to the style used by the American Psychological Association (APA Style  $6^{th}$  Edition).

#### **Additional Guidelines**

- Paper should be original, unpublished and plagiarism free (less than 10%).
- The Abstract and full paper should have the Author Name and affiliation along with E-Mail ID and Mobile Number.
- Only one co-author has been allowed with each paper.
- The full paper must be enclosed with filled in registration form.
- The abstract/full paper must be submitted through e-mail only (email: conference.law@sharda.ac.in)
- One Best Paper Award shall be given during the each session of the conference.
