2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

The University from its very inception has had a learner centric approach which has evolved through the years. The curriculum is regularly revised with feedback received from subject experts, industry experts as well as student consultative committees constituted in every department. The processes adopted by the University to strengthen teaching and make the teaching learning effective and contemporary are as follows:

**Academic Flexibility:** Students are offered a number of electives to choose from. This provides them with a wider choice of courses within their domains.



**Course Delivery**: A blended approach is employed wherein the students are exposed to hands on learning through workshops, role plays and live projects so as to make learning a relevant and enjoyable experience. Effective use of technology as a pedagogical tool is also steadily evolving through the Learning Management System, a robust online portal which enables students to access all course related information.

**Collaborative courses:** With a view to meet the 21<sup>st</sup> century learners' needs, the University has introduced courses in collaboration with industry partners like KPMG, Times Pro and a number of reputed multinational companies.

**Skill Based courses**: Taking cognizance of the skills gap which exists in the country, a number of skill based courses are introduced periodically to retain the contemporariness and dynamism in the curriculum. The University also lays great emphasis on bridging the linguistic issues faced by students coming from diverse backgrounds.

**Global exposure:** Catering to the needs of learners from across the globe and all Indian states, the University has introduced a course in Indian Culture and Heritage for undergraduate students to give them an overview of our rich cultural heritage. Students aspiring to travel overseas for further education have the option of equipping themselves with working knowledge of international Languages. Students from the business school engage in international tours which provide them with global exposure.

**Experiential Learning/ Taking learning beyond a fixed curriculum:** With the aim to making learning exciting and experiential, an initiative towards 'Tinkering Labs' have been taken in areas of Computer Science & Engineering, Automobile Engineering and Electrical & Electronics Engineering.

**Close Academic Monitoring:** The University has strengthened its academic monitoring system through intensive academic counselling, keeping checks on student attendance through an online system accessible to parents and providing remedial sessions to slow learners identified by academic advisors. Regular lectures audits by heads of departments and Deans keeps a close check on the quality of teaching.



#### 5.8 Details of gender sensitization programmes

A Gender Sensitization Committee Against Sexual Harassment (GSCASH)' was set up by the University vide notification SU/Reg./Notification/2013/106 dated January 28,2013 in response to the letter D.O.No.F.1-1/2013 (CM) dated 1<sup>st</sup> January 2013 from the Acting Chairman, UGC. This body has the mandate for ensuring prevention of sexual harassment and to provide the safety & security of girl students as well as the women employees of the University. The Committee has framed rules and procedures on complaint filing, its screening, procedure of inquiry and communication of inquiry findings. The committee has been renamed as Internal Complaints Committee in 2016-17.

Activities Undertaken by Internal complaints Committee in 2016 - 17:

- (1) Four Meetings were conducted during the year to have broad discussions on the following issues:
  - Organizing the Awareness Programmes / Workshops on Gender Sensitization within the University premises by using Circulars / Hoardings / Banners etc. with the contact details of Committee members.
  - Applying rules and procedures of complaint filing, its screening, procedure of inquiry and communication of inquiry findings to facilitate smooth working of the Committee. Constitution of 'School Complaint Committee' also referred as 'Screening Committee' for the specific cases reported to the Committee.
  - Specific Inquiry conducted and action taken to resolve the cases



- (2) An interactive session with Prof. Maithree Wickramasinghe, Prof.Kumudu Wijewardene and Prof.Camena Guneratne, Members of Standing Committee on Gender Equity, UGC, Sri Lanka and GSCASH members, Sharda University was conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> Jan.2016.
- (3) An Orientation Session on Gender Sensitization and Sexual Harassment was conducted by Dr.Sukhdeep Singh, Dr.Ekta Choudhary and Mr.Desh Ratan for first year students taking admission in the Session 2016-17 on 2-3 August, 2016.

Four cases of harassment and misbehaviour have been reported so far and strict actions have been taken.

#### 6. Governance, Leadership and Management

#### 6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

- 6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System
  - Yes, the University is using Oracle PeopleSoft ERP supporting business process of Accounts, Human Resources and Campus Solutions. This facilitates overall transactional and reporting capability.
  - This ERP is also integrated with mobile applications for automating specific student lifecycle areas like Attendance, Learning Management System etc.
  - In the campus Internet over Wi-Fi is available to authorised recipients (student faculty & staff) under strict "AAA' authentication system " Uni- Box-500"
  - The Internet bandwidth is being used from two different ISP. The amount of bandwidth delivered from ISP's are One Gbps and 465 Mbps respectively.
- 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:
  - 6.3.1 Curriculum Development
  - Regular updating of curriculum is done with the intent of providing fair balance between conceptual content and application content.
  - Curriculum modules are updated at the beginning of Academic year and are carried at various levels. First level is carried out by Faculty Board – constituted of senior Professors and HOD of respective area. Second level- Board of Studies composed of Industry representatives, Area heads and Dean of School. The school level recommendations are deliberated by Academic Council to ensure their alignment to



mission of University. The approved recommendations are then implemented and monitored at the school & faculty level.

• All programs are run on semester pattern, except those governed by respective councils. School of Applied Health Sciences will implement semester system from the academic year 2017-18.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Area wise Academic review is conducted at departmental level to discuss issues faced by students in learning
- LMS has been introduced for sharing online lecture plans, notes, and assignments etc. with students.
- Remedial classes for a number of subjects are conducted by the schools to help slow learners. Remedial English is offered to students from diverse backgrounds to help them bridge the linguistic gap. Communicative Hindi classes for international students to acclimatize themselves to the local environment have been conducted by SOLC.
- V-attendance application is used for recording student attendance as well as enabling students to check their attendance in real time.
- Apart from formal teaching feedback System, informal teaching feedback is obtained from student consultative committees at school level.
- Industrial visits, workshops and guest lecturers have increased.
- Faculty members are motivated to engage in MOOC (Massive Online Open Courses)
- 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation
- External Audit of examinations is integral part to ensure quality upgradation in the evaluation system.
- University Examination system is based on Continuous Assessment process which captures students on going progress through traditional pencil paper evaluation and also experiential techniques like role plays and presentations. Skill based components of pedagogy are captured in Continuous Assessment.
- Students are made aware of examination process and rules and regulations in the beginning of academic year itself. Examination process champions at school level explain the examination details to students during the Program Orientation sessions.
- Students are shown evaluated answer sheets of examinations including end term examinations.
- Result analysis is prepared by all academic departments; the data is used to improve pedagogy and contents for concerned subjects.
- Basic strategy is to ensure fair and continuous evaluation with utmost transparency.



#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

- Quality awareness has been created to increase publication of papers in Scopus indexed journals.
- Scheme of seed money for research launched (notification no: SU/Reg/Notification/2017/346)
- Workshops organised on formulation of research proposals
- Various conferences have been organized by different schools.
- Incentive schemes aid in creating motivating environment for the faculty to seek research grant from government and corporate.
- Provide financial and administrative help to faculty in filing patents

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Library systems are automated and upgraded for latest features.
- ERP system of the University is upgraded to latest version for future preparedness.
- Strong emphasis on automation and digitisation of systems that led to solutions like Virtual Attendance, eLearning/LMS, Library system, HR Support System, Hostel Automation, Dynamic Quality Forms, Passport/Visa reminder utility, Automated Question paper system etc. thereby reducing turnaround time and bringing operational efficiency.
- Efforts have made towards realising the aim of a green campus through a number of plantation drives
- Amenities on campus like, departmental & medical stores, Apple service centre, gymnasium, auditoriums, food outlets and playgrounds are operational

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Conducted capacity building programs like Faculty Development Program, Research Workshops for faculty as well as training programs for other employees.
- Industry and Academia experts are invited to guest lectures.
- Performance Appraisal is conducted annually for employees, both permanent and contractual in association. Performance Appraisal and Reward system (PARS)-is a appraisal tool used for Faculty (PARS-F) and Staff (PARS-S).
- Induction programs are offered to all newly inducted faculty. Team building is an important component of all developmental programs.



#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff Recruitment

- Analysis of manpower requirement is done during annual academic planning to ensure optimum utilisation of faculty and staff.
- Both Internal and External sources of recruitment are used to enhance diversity and raise sufficient pool of candidates for selection at all levels.
- Employee referrals scheme is also used for filling faculty positions.

- Faculty training conducted by Global Logic, Tech Mahindra and Sector Skill Councils-NASSCOM, ESSC, TSSC, RSDC, PSSC on emerging technologies.
- Conducted Industry- Academia meet on and off the campus.











Learning Management System (SULMS): SULMS is a learning platform designed to provide educators, administrators and learners with a single robust, secure and integrated system to create personalised learning environments. SULMS provides a flexible tool-set to support both, blended learning with 100% online courses and platform for student faculty interaction. This software solution provides facility for faculty to upload class notes, assignments, and quizzes for easy sharing with students. Students also have information about important notifications for students along with course related information. LMS is also equipped with feedback system for students to register their feedback about course studied by them. SULMS is web-based and so can be accessed from anywhere in the world. With a default mobile-compatible interface and cross-browser compatibility, content on the SULMS platform is easily accessible and consistent across different web browsers and devices.

**LIBSYS7:** University has a modernized Learning Resource center which has Libsys7 library management solutions for comprehensive management of library resources. Libsys7 leverages the power of internet to perform combined search on Z39.50, SRU/SRW and Libsys databases. User has the freedom to choose the servers to be included in the search.

E-Resources: University subscribes regularly to e-Resources to provide access to faculty and students devoted to research with latest publications. University LRC has subscription to Springer, IEEE, ASCE, ASME, K"nimbus, DELNET, Manupatra, AIR Manuals, Westlaw India Services, EBSCO Management e-books collection, Medline Online Database and E- Journals EBSCO Business Source.

**Campus Lynx:** This software is used to collect student attendance. It enables students to access their attendance status and notifies the ones with short attendance. The software also enables the following:

• Report of the attendance is mailed to his/her login periodically and SMS is also sent to the pre-registered mobile number.

• List of students falling short of attendance is also generated and the information (if debarred) is sent to the concerned. A student may opt for his / her choice of courses and apply for the examination. The result of the student is published online. A student may check his/ her result by logging in through his id/ password and check the result. In addition a student may submit his/ her application to the office on mail. (mail to VC, Registrar, CoE, Dean etc.) It also acts as an Examination Management Software. The following illustrates further:

- The copy of the Admit Card is also available on the login.

- The CA and MTE marks, once posted by the teacher are visible to the student through the self service.
- The final result (Grade Report) is also available on the login

**v-attendance**: v -attendance utilizes an innovative mobile App to take, track and manage attendance across different subject taught in the University. v- attendance also provides a cloud hosted portal to generate various reports and data analytics regarding the attendance across University and provides a real-time tracking of attendance. , v- attendance provides multiple roles such as Administration, Dean, HoD, Faculty and Student. There is a separate version of v -attendance for students to enable them to track their subject attendance throughout the semester.

**Mentor-Mentee Platform:** The Mentor-Mentee platform provides a cloud hosted portal to manage various mentorship activities across the various schools. The purpose of the platform is to encourage interaction between Mentor and Mentee in a planned and scheduled manner, which can be tracked, monitored and evaluated.
