A Report Interactive Workshop on Participatory Learning Approaches with Faculty Members

January 27, 2018 Venue: Block 7, 202

Context, background & need

Sharda University offers a diverse range of programmes across thirteen schools and caters to a vast diversity of students from seventy- two countries and twenty-nine Indian states. In this context, there is a need for faculty members to upskill themselves with new and good teaching learning practices to enhance the quality and overall learning experience of the student-community. The thirteen schools at the university regularly conduct faculty development programmes pertaining to innovative teaching learning methodologies; however there was a need to initiate dialogue between faculty members from various disciplines to learn and share innovative tools of teaching and learning.

The IQAC identified this area of capacity building for faculty members and institutionalizing good teaching practices to enhance the quality of teaching .Prof. Ranjit Goswami, Director IQAC proposed a series of faculty development programmes which would provide Deans, Heads of departments and faculty of various schools a common platform to address academic issues & challenges that faculty members have to deal with in the classroom.

This workshop was the first in the series.

- Student- centric Teaching methods
- Using alternate/ interactive models within the limitation of time & completion of Syllabi
- Understanding Participatory learning and using it as an effective learning tool

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Overview:





The workshop was attended by 70 participants including deans, heads of departments and faculty members from 13 schools of the university.

The interactive workshop was divided into 2 sessions. The workshop commenced with a short session introducing the theme of the programme by Prof. Ranjit Goswami, Director, IQAC & Pro VC, Sharda University.

Prof. B.S Panwar, Vice Chancellor, Sharda University also shared his insights on participatory learning through some real life examples.

The first session on Participatory learning approaches was conducted by Prof. Vijay Gupta, Professor Emeritus, Sharda University. The session focussed on understanding and problematising the term, Participatory learning. Prof. Gupta whose teaching career spans over 50 years, shared a number of real life examples of innovative methods of teaching which had been trialled and tested. This gave the audience an insight into the various ways in which students participated in the learning process in and beyond the classroom.

The second session was conducted by Dr. Sachin Sinha, Associate Professor, School of Business Studies, Sharda University. Dr. Sinha's session delved upon the different learning styles of the 21st century student and analysed the teaching learning process from a psychological perspective. The session was also in many ways a sum of the wealth of experience Dr. Sinha brought with him.

Both sessions had a question & answer round wherein the audience could discuss and find solutions to common challenges.

At the end of the workshop, senior members from the audience shared their feedback on the workshop experiences and good teaching practices. It served to be an enriching experience for all participants







Please suggest other areas of capacity building with an aim to enhance the quality of the teaching learning process.


- MOOC, Projects
